





What a week!

100 Days of Cree was recommended in The New York Times. The Globe and Mail ran a two-page spread on Mudeater, and Firewater nabbed the #3 spot on CBC's 150 picks for Canada's anniversary.

We also launched a podcast series called How Books Happen, which lifts the veil on our often-romanticized industry. To meet the high standards set by our publishing program, we have hired veteran CBC producer Sean Prpick to give us a hand. Two episodes are already posted, and we will produce ten more throughout the year. They are available from our new website and through podcasthosting services like iTunes and Spotify.

In the latest episode, I chat with Michael Langan, the founder of Colonialism Skateboards, who grew up in Cote First Nation in Treaty 4. Michael explains how Clearing the Plains inspired him to start his company, and reveals what he thinks about Canada and our collective history. It's a powerful interview. I also talk with publishers at the London Book Fair and at a meeting for the Association of Canadian Publishers in Toronto. I ask them what they are reading, what they are working on, and how they got into publishing.

In a "Podcast extra," I have a conversation with educator Sarah Longman about why she brought The Education of Augie Merasty into the school system. She shares how the book gave her greater insight into the effects residential schooling had on her own family and offers a heartbreaking clue as to why Augie Merasty took so long to write his memoir. This spring we also launched the **Henry** and Mary Bibb Black Canadian Studies series, with Afua Cooper as its editor. This is the first Black Studies series coming from a Canadian university press. To bolster the program and create a home for black writers, we have begun a trade list that explores "Africa and its Diaspora." Whitney French is editing a collection called Black Writing Matters that takes the pulse of contemporary Black Canada, while an analysis of Black Lives Matter by the activists themselves is in the works. We have books in development by refugees from the Sudan and Somalia, as well as a memoir by a survivor of the Congolese war.

We honour our motto-"a voice for many peoples"-with our editorial choices and hiring decisions. Tune into How Books Happen to hear how those voices resonate, and for the inside scoop on publishing. Over the course of the program we will also reveal how to publish a national bestseller. We've had six so far and hope our approach can act as a model for other independent Canadian publishers.



Antigone Undone offers an urgent and mesmerizing account of the creative and destructive power of great art.


n 2015 Will Aitken journeyed to
Luxembourg for the rehearsals and
premiere of Anne Carson's translation
of Sophokles' 5th-century BCE tragedy
Antigone, starring Juliette Binoche and
directed by theatrical sensation Ivo van Hove.

In repeatedly watching the play, he became awestruck with the plight of the young woman at the centre of the action. "Look at what these men are doing to me," Antigone cries, expressing the predicament of the dispossessed throughout time. Transfixed by the strange and uncanny power of the play, he finds himself haunted by its protagonist, finally resulting in his own suicidal breakdown.

With a backstage view of the action, Aitken illuminates the creative process of Carson, Binoche, and Van Hove and offers a rare glimpse into collaborative genius in action. He also investigates the response to the play by Kierkegaard, Virginia Woolf, Judith Butler, and others who, like him, were moved by its timeless protest against injustice.

Will Aitken has written three novels— Realia, A Visit Home, and Terre Haute—as well as Death in Venice: A Queer Film Classic. He lives in Montreal, Quebec.

Named as a tribute to Saskatchewan's capital city and its rich history of boldness and innovation, **The Regina Collection** builds upon our motto of "a voice for many peoples." *Antigone Undone* is the eighth title in the series.


eaving together the narratives of female farmers from across three continents, Women Who Dig offers a critical look at how women are responding to and increasingly rising up against the injustices of the global food system.





Surviving PTSD and Changing Mental Health Culture


fter serving in Rwanda during
the 1994 genocide and civil war,
Lieutenant Colonel Stéphane
Grenier returned to Canada haunted
by his experiences. Facing post-traumatic stress
disorder and an archaic establishment, he
spent ten years confronting—and changing—the
military mental health system from within.

Coining the term "Operational Stress Injury" to allow the military to see mental injury in the same light as a physical wound, Grenier founded the Operational Stress Injury Social Support program that provides help for mentally injured soldiers and veterans.

Since retiring from the military in 2012, his groundbreaking approach has been adopted by civilian society. Working with the Mental Health Commission of Canada, he founded Mental Health Innovations, a social enterprise which delivers Grenier's direct "walk the talk" method to improve mental well-being in government and business.

Stéphane Grenier is a veteran of the Canadian Military who retired as a Lieutenant Colonel. The recipient of a Meritorious Service Cross by the Governor General, he was recently awarded an honourary Doctor of Laws by the University of Guelph. He lives in Val-des-Monts, Québec.

Adam Montgomery, PhD, is an historian of medicine and military history and the author of *The Invisible Injured*. He lives in Grimsby, Ontario.


sychedelic Revolutionaries recounts the history of hallucinogenic-drug research in Saskatchewan, and the pioneering work of Humphry Osmond, Abram Hoffer, and Duncan Blewett. They broke new ground in the 1950s and '60s in the use of hallucinogens, like mescaline and LSD, and the development of treatments for alcoholism and schizophrenia—until Timothy Leary hit the scene and undermined everything with his public pronouncements.

Delving into the experiments, the researchers, as well as connections to notables like Aldous Huxley, Linus Pauling, and Alcoholics Anonymous Co-Founder Bill W, *Psychedelic Revolutionaries* examines popularly held myths surrounding the drugs. It shows how the Saskatchewan research made extensive contributions to this scientific field and led to radical innovations in mental health, many of which have applications and relevance today.

The Prairie Populist

George Hara Williams and the Untold Story of the CCF

eorge Hara Williams was the most successful of the early leaders of the CCF in Saskatchewan. But his role in the party was undermined by Tommy Douglas and M. J. Coldwell, and now he is largely forgotten.

The populist who mobilized farmers of the province to support a socialist platform, Williams was one of five MLAs elected in the 1934 election, becoming Leader of the Opposition. He firmly supported socialists participating in the struggle against fascism, including military action, a position not held by everyone in the party. While Williams was serving overseas, a campaign to replace him as leader, led by Coldwell and Douglas, was successful.

Until now, the full story of Williams's role in building the CCF and bringing it to the threshold of power, and his defeat as leader, has never been told.

J.F. Conway is a professor of sociology at the University of Regina and the author of *The Rise of the New West.* He has published extensively on agrarian populism and the emergence of the CCF in Saskatchewan and the Social Credit movement in Alberta. He lives in Regina, Saskatchewan.


ouis Riel prophesied that a polyglot Métis nation would rise on the prairies five hundred years after his death, and that it would be called by the "joyous name" of the House of Charlemagne. This new polity would be built on the principles of Riel's Massinahican, a radical philosophical system which now survives only in fragments. Its hallmarks would be justice and the blurring of all separations dividing women and men, the earth and human beings. The House of Charlemagne tracks the birth of this ideal nation in the burning imagination of the young settler Henry Jackson, who took the name Honoré Jaxon after his encounter with Riel's thought.

Commissioned by Edward Poitras as a text for dancers, Tim Lilburn's poem gives voice and body to Riel's visionary metaphysics. As the Jury citation said of the Governor General's Award-winning *Kill-Site*, "Lilburn's work is richly figurative, but firmly rooted in colloquial speech. He is not only a virtuoso at the linguistic level, taking risks with metaphor and line, but also steeped in a metaphysics of place."

Tim Lilburn is a Governor General Award-winning poet and an essayist, and the author of ten books of poetry, including *Assiniboia* and *The Names* and the essay collection *Living In the World As If It Were Home*. He lives in Victoria, British Columbia.



he Great Depression of the 1930s often recalls images of the drought-stricken Great Plains. Prolonged drought exacerbated the economic effects of the Great Depression to such a degree that the prairies became the epicentre of the disaster in Canada. Between 1929 and 1932, per capita incomes fell by 49% in Manitoba, 61% in Alberta and an astounding 72% in Saskatchewan. The result was enormous social and political upheaval that sent shockwaves through the rest of the country.

In this sixth volume of the History of the Prairie West series, contributors explore the cultural, political, and economic repercussions of climate change and financial upheaval on the region and its people.

Gregory P. Marchildon is Ontario Research Chair in Health Policy and System Design at the Institute of Health Policy, Management and Evaluation at the University of Toronto. He lives in Toronto, Ontario.



rom the efforts of its first librarian, who ensured immigrants could access books in their own languages, to the present day as an active community hub, the library has been responsible for many groundbreaking Canadian firsts.

The Regina Public Library implemented the country's first fully automated library system, established the first writer-in-residence program, pioneered English as a Second Language classes, hosted Indigenous storytelling circles, and was instrumental in developing a single, one-card system for all of Saskatchewan.

With contributions from community members, *Biblio Files* covers the library's entire history and demonstrates why it is such a beloved and necessary institution.
