Publishers Weekly has called University of Regina Press (URP) "more than a little house on the prairie," while *The Chronicle* of Higher Education Review said we are "the little house that could." Now that URP has turned five years old, we are both proud of our accomplishments and looking towards the future.

With seven national bestsellers produced since our launch in June 2013, New York University Press (NYUP) approached us to partner with them. We just negotiated a deal to put our books in their catalogue, and beginning in January 2019, they will market our books in the United States and sell them through the Columbia University Press rep group. This partnership will allow us to expand our publishing program in radical new ways.

Our motto, "a voice for many peoples," includes 90-year-olds, trans kids, settlers of Saskatchewan, Indigenous writers, and many others, and will now include writers from around the globe. We have three titles from Africa in the works and another from Guatemala in development. We want to publish non-Canadian perspectives as well as our own, help spark conversations about colonialism and Indigeneity worldwide, give our authors international exposure, and strengthen the house through an enhanced bottom line. We are also working with First Nations University of Canada to establish a publishing program there starting in fall 2019, and helping to train the next generation of publishers. These young people will change the face of our industry, amplify the Indigenous voice, and tell stories not now being told. We hope one day that they will run the house.

In our first five years we have established a foundation from which to thrive. We will continue to put our authors front and centre, and the creativity and hard work that has made that possible will continue too. I'm excited about all the possibilities and opportunities.





Rita Shelton Deverell is a television broadcaster, social activist, and a founder of Vision TV. Deverell moved to Canada in 1967 from Houston, Texas, and has been named to the Maclean's Honour Roll of Outstanding Canadians, the Canadian Broadcasters' Hall of Fame, and the Order of Canada.

his new edition of *Clearing the Plains* has a foreword by Pulitzer Prizewinning author, Elizabeth A. Fenn, and explanations of the book's influence by leading Canadian historians. etween 1869 and 1877 the government of Canada negotiated Treaties One through Seven with the Indigenous peoples of the Great Plains. Many historians argue that the negotiations suffered from cultural misunderstandings between the treaty commissioners and Indigenous chiefs, but newly uncovered eyewitness accounts show that the Canadian government had a strategic plan to deceive over the "surrender clause" and land sharing.

According to Sheldon Krasowski's research, Canada understood that the Cree, Anishnabeg, Saulteaux, Assiniboine, Siksika, Piikani, Kainaa, Stoney and Tsuu T'ina nations wanted to share the land with newcomers-with conditionsbut were misled over governance, reserved lands, and resource sharing. Exposing the government chicanery at the heart of the negotiations, *No Surrender* demonstrates that the land remains Indigenous.



ficial stories from media centers in New York and Mexico City say that most violence in Latin America is a product of the drug trade. Global capital and violence reinforce conditions that fortify the current economic order, and whether it be the military, police, or death squads that pull the trigger, economic expansion benefits from the violent elimination of the opposition, who are most often dispossessed Indigenous people.
